



## Comcast Renews Platinum-level Commitment to Internet Society

### Comcast co-hosts Internet Engineering Task Force meeting

[Washington, D.C. and Geneva, Switzerland – March 11, 2013] – For the sixth consecutive year, Comcast has renewed its commitment to the Internet Society as a Platinum Organization Supporter, providing the highest level of support to the organization and its work to promote the open development, evolution, and use of the Internet for people throughout the world.

Comcast is also a co-sponsor of the Internet Engineering Task Force (IETF) meeting, IETF 86, in Orlando, Florida, March 10-15. This is the second consecutive IETF meeting co-hosted by Comcast. IETF 86 will bring together more than 1,000 engineers, computer scientists, and researchers from around the world who lead the development of Internet standards.
