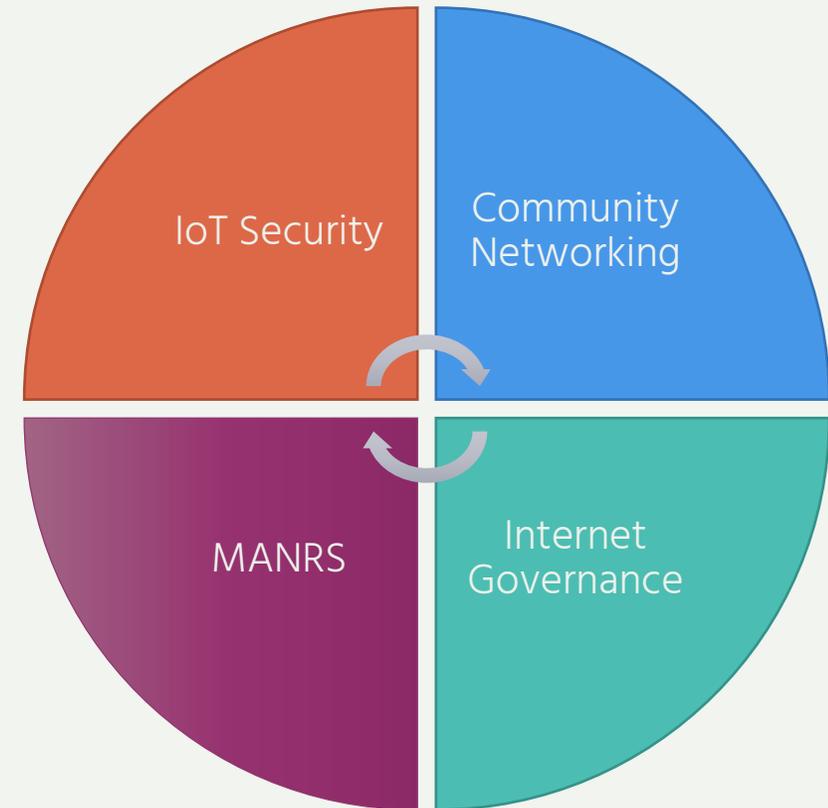
Advocacy

These campaigns organize a wide range of activities to achieve well-defined outcomes and inspire actions by those who can advance our shared priorities.

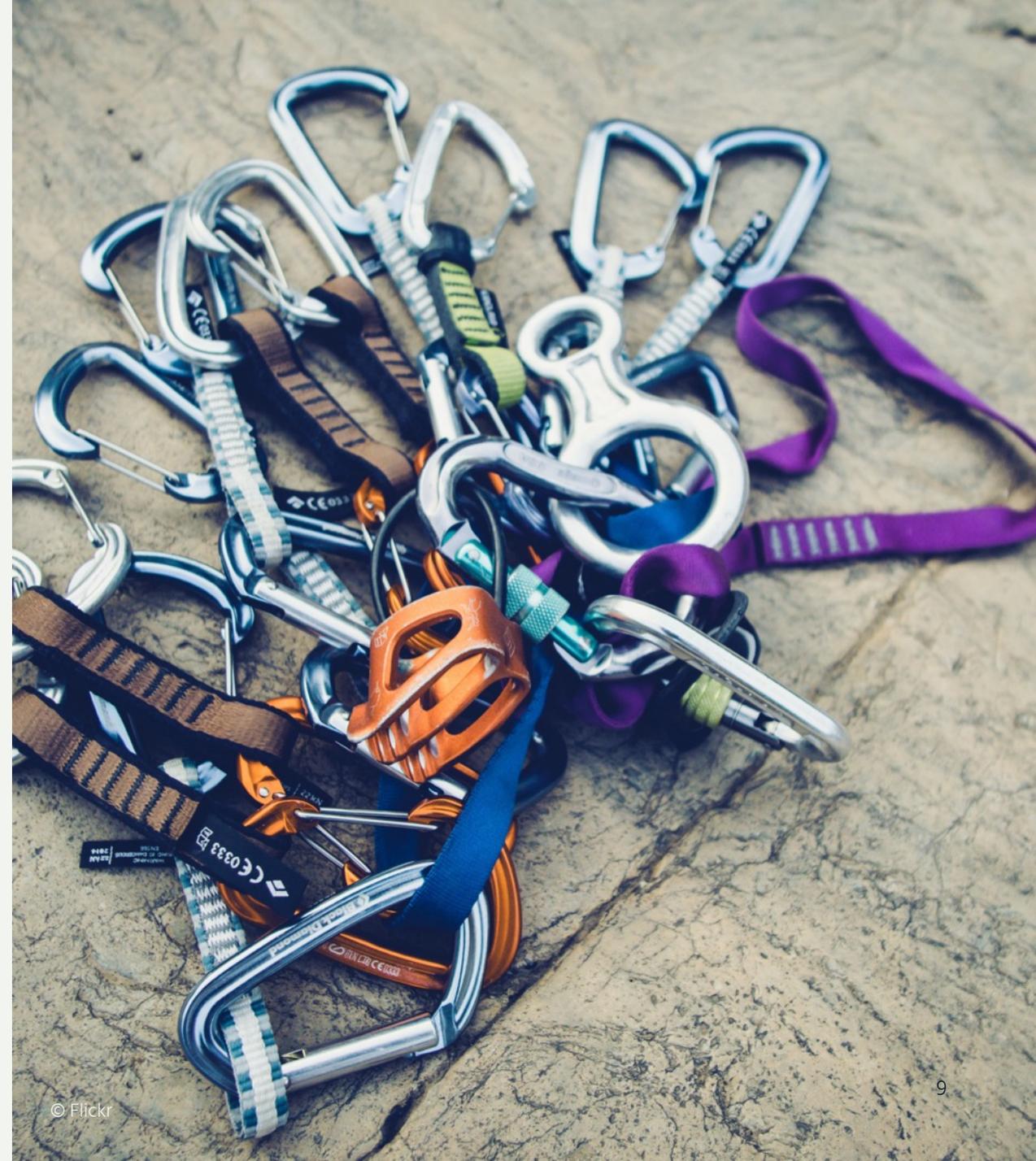
By applying the talent, resources, and commitment from across our community, **we have the ability to shape tomorrow.**



Securing the Internet of Things

GOAL: Adoption of Security and Privacy practices to protect the network, users, and critical information infrastructure from cyber threats.

- Global adoption and implementation of the OTA IoT Trust Framework
- Leverage the influence of consumers to drive security and privacy capabilities of IoT devices
- Influence government policies & regulations



Strengthening the Global Routing System

GOAL: Global adoption of Mutually Agreed Norms for Routing Security (MANRS) to improve the security and resiliency of the Internet's routing.

- Establish MANRS as globally recognized best practice
- Secure widespread adoption and implementation by Network Operators
- Build a community of adopters and strengthen their resources
- Obtain longer-term MANRS sustainability



Innovating to Connect the World

GOAL: Use the Community Networks model as a means to further extend the reach of the Internet to remote, rural, and underserved areas.

- Demonstrate replicable models that represent new ways of working
- Influencing changes in policy frameworks to enable community networks to flourish
- Scaling deployment of, and ensuring continuity for, the Community Network model



Promoting Collaborative Governance

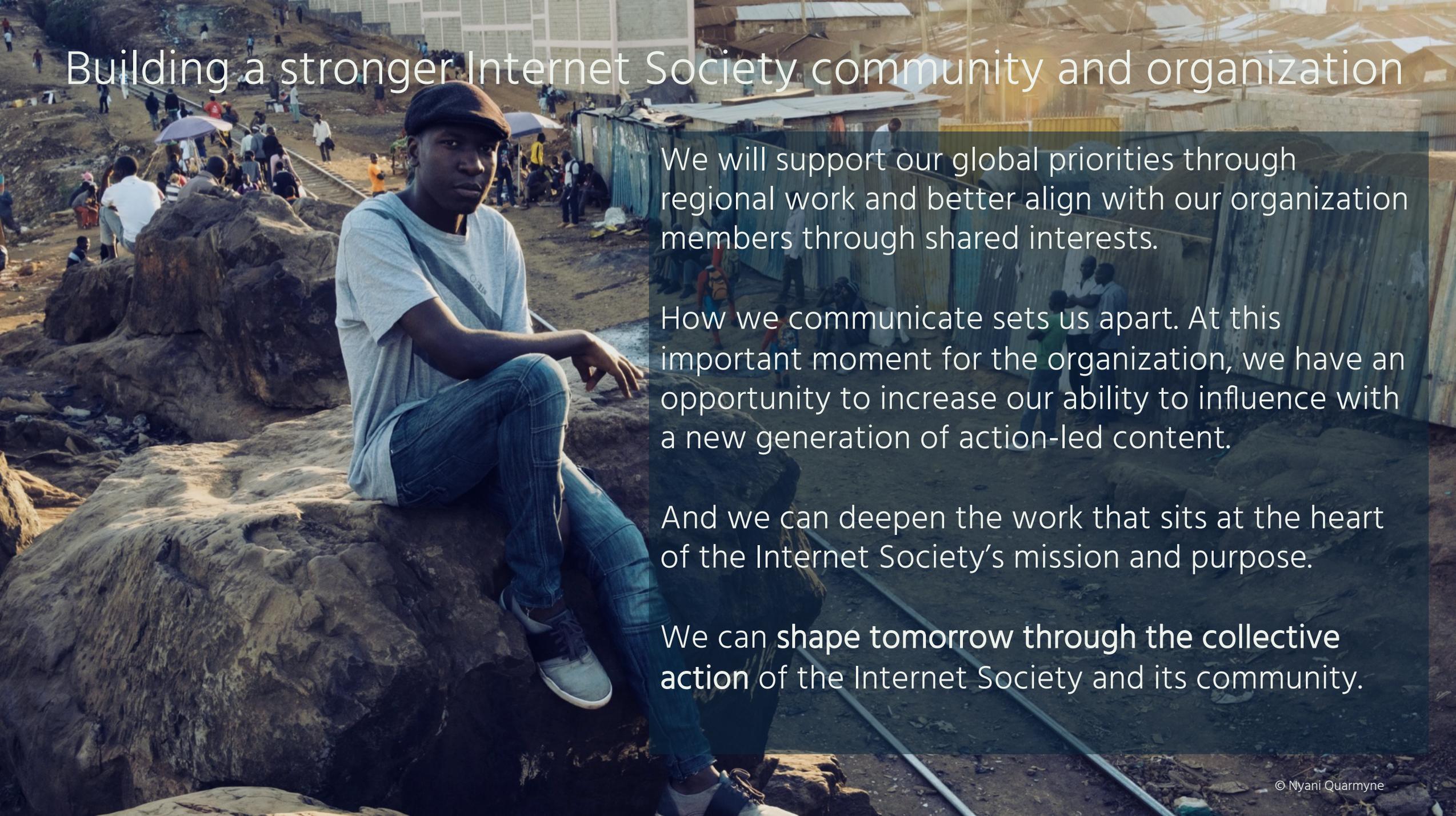
GOAL: Obtain global use of the multistakeholder model to address Internet policy and governance issues.

- Encouraging key governments' adoption
- Ensuring intergovernmental organizations engagement with all stakeholders
- Rebuilding momentum for the multistakeholder model in global conversations

GOAL: Ensure the success of ISOC's Chapters to advance our mission through funding, collaboration, and communication.

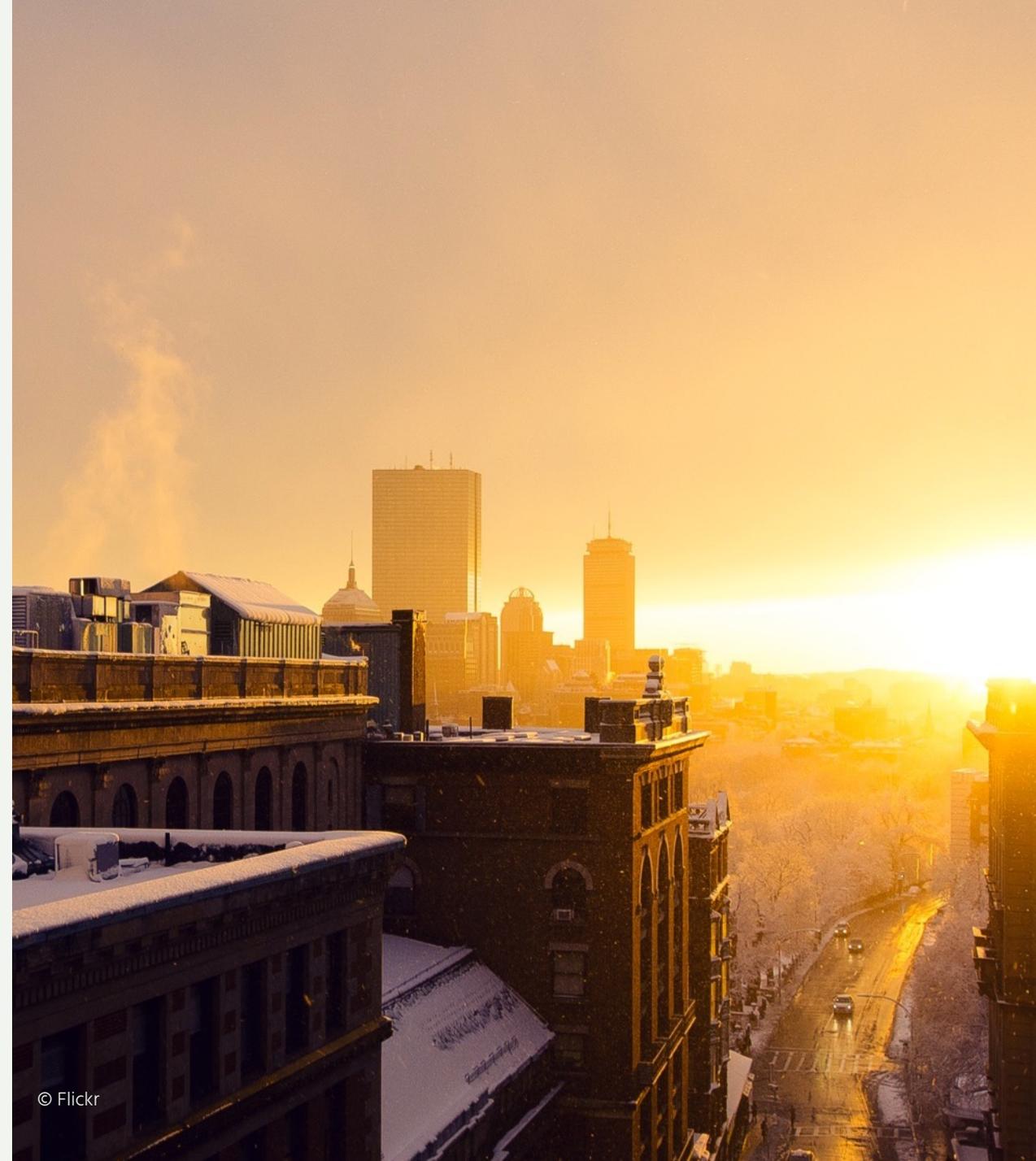
- Beyond the Net grant program

They will both support and amplify what we already do, as well as creating new avenues to be a **more powerful agent of change for the future.**



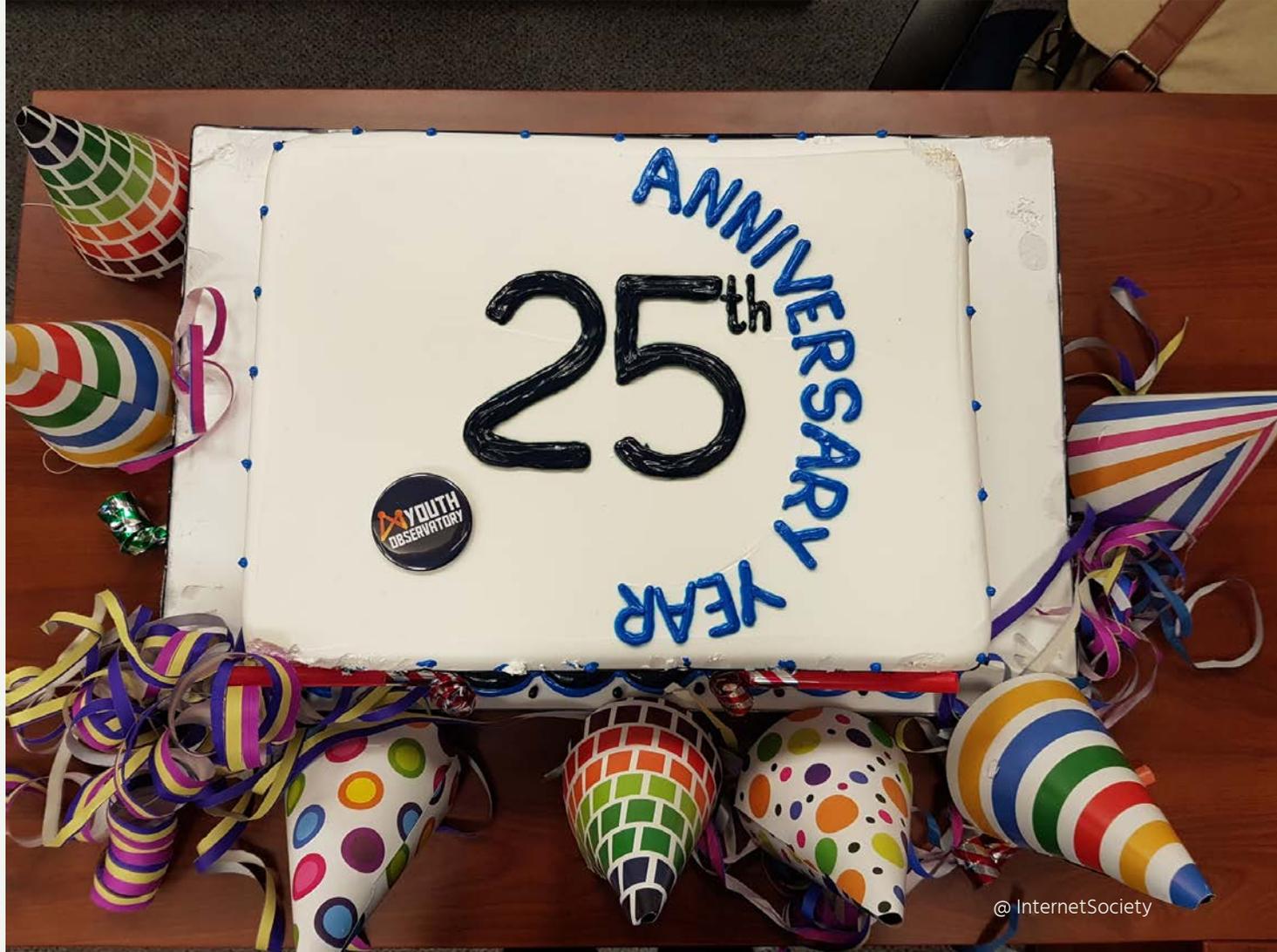
