


About Ofcom

- We manage radio spectrum in the UK
- We want to
 - see comprehensive mobile coverage across the country
 - create opportunities for innovation across the UK economy, including ensuring sufficient spectrum is available for 5G
- We make spectrum available through various authorisation methods such as
 - award national /regional licence
 - licence individual radio transmitters
 - exempt radio equipment from the need to hold licence (licence exemption)
 - issue innovation and trial licence for non commercial use



Local licensing in bands supporting mobile technologies



Shared Access licence: Access to 4 Ofcom managed bands

1800 MHz (DECT guard band) $: 2 \times 3.3 \text{ MHz}$ (FDD)

2390 – 2400 MHz : 10 MHz

3.8 - 4.2 GHz : 10 - 100 MHz

24.25 – 26.5 GHz : 50, 100 and 200 MHz


Local Access licence: Access to spectrum licenced on national basis to MNOs

Shared Access licence

First come first served managed access, deployment within 6 months of obtaining licence



1800 and 2300 MHz : £80 per licence / year 3.8 – 4.2 GHz : £80 per 10 MHz / year 26 GHz : £320 per licence / year
